
GA 400 Transit Initiative Overview





FULTON COUNTY TRANSIT MASTER PLAN

- Completed in Spring 2018
- Focus on expanding rapid bus services
 - Georgia 400 BRT
 - South Fulton Parkway BRT
 - Holcomb Bridge Road ART
 - Roosevelt Highway ART
 - Enhanced local bus service
 - Last mile connectivity
 - Bus shelters
 - Rail station upgrades
 - South Fulton park-and-ride facility
- I-285 study initiated in 2018 focusing on BRT





GA 400 BRT

- Fulton County considerations:
 - BRT in express lanes
 - Windward Pkwy to North Springs MARTA rail station
 - 12 miles
 - Capital costs = \$242 \$300 million
 - Potential New MARTA sales tax = \$42 –
 \$100 million (post referendum)
 - Annual O&M costs = \$5.2 7.8 million
 - Existing MARTA sales tax

GA 400 TRANSIT SCHEDULE



MARTA/GDOT/FULTON COORDINATION

• Funding:

- Express lanes funded through GDOT's MMIP program
- \$100 million in General Obligation bonds for BRT infrastructure
- Potential BRT funding from FTA's Small Starts Program
- Potential local BRT funding through Fulton County
- Other potential sources: STP Urban, Highway Flex Funds, Local and State Partners

• Schedule:

- Construction for express lanes is scheduled for 2022
- Express lanes conducting environmental assessment
- BRT environmental documentation waiting on station locations
- Next steps for GA 400 Transit Initiative:
 - Advance station design and revise project as needed
 - Identify station area park and rides
 - Identify local funding (e.g. Fulton County referendum)






GA 400 POTENTIAL STATION LOCATIONS

Potential Stations:

- Windward Parkway (Off-Line)
- Old Milton Parkway (Inline)
- North Point Mall (Inline)
- Holcomb Bridge Road (Inline)
- North Springs

Other Potential Connections:

- Connection to Perimeter Center and I-285 Top-End BRT
- Connection to ART/BRT routes on Holcomb Bridge Road
- Connection to ART/BRT routes on Old Milton Parkway





^{*}MARTA has committed to provide funding (currently estimated to be \$156 - \$234 million over 30 years) for operations and maintenance from existing sales tax.




NEXT STEPS


- Secure funding commitments
- Preserve station areas within context of EL project
- Complete the environmental review process
- Identify options for construction phasing
- Consider interim operations until full build out











Fulton County MARTA Sales Tax Overview



HB 930 PROVISIONS

- HB 930 allows Fulton County to pursue:
 - Up to 0.2-cent sales tax
 - Up to 30 years
- Other provisions:
 - Cannot fund heavy rail
 - Can be used for other modes
 - Land use planning/zoning done at the local level
- Referendum requirements:
 - IGA between county and cities
 - Represent >70% population outside of City of Atlanta
- Potential to generate:
 - \$28 million annually
 - \$1.2 billion over 30 years
