**A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ALPHARETTA
(THE "CITY") REGARDING FUNDING AND SPONSORSHIP OF
THE OLD SOLDIERS DAY PARADE**

WHEREAS, as a result of local and national legal uncertainties and controversies concerning the participation of certain groups in publicly-sponsored and funded parades and other events, the Mayor and the Council have determined that it is in the best interest of the citizens of the City to discontinue the sponsorship and funding of the Old Soldiers Day Parade (the "Parade"); and

WHEREAS, the City has determined that it is more appropriate for the Parade, if it is to continue, to be sponsored and funded by private entities, including non-profits, that could have different rules for parade participants;


NOW, THEREFORE, the Mayor and Council resolve as follows:

RESOLVED, that the City of Alpharetta shall no longer sponsor or financially support future Old Soldiers Day Parades; and

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED, that nothing in this Resolution shall be deemed to prohibit the continuance of the Parade under private sponsorship and financial support; provided that the Parade otherwise follows the City's ordinances for permitting of special events and the payment of City and other costs associated with the Parade.






