North Point is a place defined by mature tree canopies and connected forested areas threaded with trails and pathways to provide easy access to its many shopping, dining, and entertainment destinations.




North Point is Livable

With access to major employers, transportation options, housing choices, activity centers, and human-scale spaces, North Point well-positioned to become a livable community within the metro area.

2018 North Point LCI

In 2017, the City of Alpharetta and the Atlanta Regional Commission teamed up to study the North Point Area and update its 2008 LCI Plan. The updated plan aimed to address current challenges for growth and to create future opportunities by focusing on walkability and quality development. Through public engagement and input from city council, city staff, and private stakeholders, the consultant team made recommendations for 100-day and 5-Year action plans that were adopted by the City in February of 2018.



North Point LCI Creative Placemaking Plan

As recommended by the 2018 LCI Plan, the City of Alpharetta is pursuing a Creative Placemaking Plan that will examine options to improve safety and walkability along the North Point Parkway corridor. The study will also formulate wayfinding concepts, streetscape design guidelines, and a signage program and plan to encourage efficient and safe movement of pedestrians, bicycles and vehicles in, through and around the North Point area. The project shall recommend a diversity of types of public art to make the corridor attractive and interactive. Lastly, as part of the study process and public outreach, the City will implement a temporary project to demonstrate potential outcomes of the plan.



Terms & Definitions

The Atlanta Regional Commission's Livable Centers Initiative (LCI) is a grant program that incentivizes local jurisdictions to re-envision their communities as vibrant, walkable places that offer increased mobility options, encourage healthy lifestyles and provide improved access to jobs and services.¹

Placemaking inspires people to collectively reimagine and reinvent public spaces as the heart of every community. Strengthening the connection between people and the places they share, placemaking refers to a collaborative process by which we can shape our public realm in order to maximize shared value. More than just promoting better urban design, placemaking facilitates creative patterns of use, paying particular attention to the physical, cultural, and social identities that define a place and support its ongoing evolution.²

Ecodistricts are distinct areas or neighborhoods that provide a uniquely valuable scale to introduce and accelerate investments that can achieve profound improvements in equity, resilience, and climate protection - linking energy, transportation, water, and land use in an integrated, efficient resource system. These neighborhoods are small enough to innovate and big enough to leverage meaningful investment and public policy.³


PARKway Typical Section









