

2021-2022 PROGRAM FAQ's

The City of Alpharetta has been working diligently to prepare for our programs. We want to meet the needs of our community while emphasizing and meeting safety guidelines.

These FAQ's are guided by the Governor's Executive Orders and CDC guidelines. Should the numbers change at any time, protocol will shift to follow those orders and guidelines set forth by the above-noted agencies.

1. Programs will be provided with sanitation supplies and staff will guide each participant to assist in this process.
2. Participants will not be allowed to bring items from home that can be shared with others.
3. Sanitation and cleaning of commonly used areas will occur.
4. Participants may wear masks, but this is not a requirement. Staff will not monitor participants when it pertains to mask wearing.
5. Staff/Instructors are not required to wear masks; many of our instructors and their staff are choosing to do so.
6. Participants will be encouraged to wash hands before and after programs. All participants will be expected to practice proper hand washing techniques.
7. Illness Protocol:
 1. If a participant presents with a temperature, cough, shortness of breath/difficulty breathing, fever, chills, muscle pain, sore throat or new loss of taste or smell while in a program, they will be given a mask to wear, be immediately separated from the group and placed in an isolated area with a staff member until they are picked up by a parent/guardian.
 2. A sick participant must be picked up by the parent/guardian or emergency contact within 30 minutes of staff's phone call; if an adult, participant must immediately leave the facility after informing staff.
 3. The participant is prevented from returning activities until they have had:
 - a. If fever only: been fever/fever mediation free for 24 hours, other symptoms have improved. Under some circumstances a note from your health care provider may be required to return to programs.

4. COVID symptoms or direct exposure with symptomatic person:
 - a. **Non-Vaccinated:** Upon notification by a healthcare provider or public health official that COVID-19 infection is diagnosed or suspected based on symptoms, the person shall immediately isolate (positive diagnostic) or quarantine (suspected).
 - b. **Fully Vaccinated:** Persons who have been **fully vaccinated** for COVID-19 (i.e., ≥ 2 weeks following receipt of the second dose in a 2-dose series, or ≥ 2 weeks following receipt of one dose of a single-dose vaccine) **and remain asymptomatic** after COVID-19 exposure **do not need to quarantine** following COVID-19 exposure.

5. If a participant in a group falls ill with COVID-like symptoms or is diagnosed with COVID, staff will immediately notify participants in that group/facility.
6. Participants will still be sent home as they would for any other illness, such as vomiting, pink eye, lice, flu symptoms, etc.
